

## Pathology Laboratory Capacity In The South West – Context

#### Generically Pathology looks like this ...



#### How many tests are done annually?

- South 1 35 million tests
- (Devon and Cornwall)
- South 2– unknown private JV
- (Taunton & Yeovil)
- South 3 35 million
- (Gloucester, Bristol, Bath, Weston)
- South 6 55 million

(Dorset, Poole, IOW, Portsmouth, Salisbury, Bournemouth and Southampton)

### What specialty or department ?

80% - 85%

2% - 5%

- Blood sciences
- Cellular Pathology
- Clinical microbiology 10% 20%
- This excludes point of care testing

## Health warning .....

- What's a "test" ?
- What's a "requestable test group" ?
- What's a "request" ?
- What's a "sample" or "specimen" ?
- How many tests per request ?
  - Blood sciences in the SW average 6.9
  - Clinical microbiology in the SW average 2.2

# Who's asking for all these tests ?

- SW average for direct access ("GP") tests:
  - 49% Blood sciences
  - 5% Histopathology
  - 38% Clinical Microbiology
- Broad groups of requestors:
  - GP
  - Outpatients
  - Acute
  - Emergency
  - Community
  - Tertiary

#### Why are these test's being requested ?

- Diagnosis
- Treatment
- Monitoring
- Screening
- Prevention
- Acute management
- Emergency

# IT, IT, IT and IT, and contracts

- Electronic requesting ("ICE" for example) allows for rules based requesting
- Networks and/or individual laboratories are not all connected well enough to allow transfer of workload at higher volumes
- Networks and sites may have different providers
